plant hanger left in ceiling	carpet burns, tears, stains or other marks
low number of small nail holes	damage to wood floor
stain on ceiling caused by leaky roof	tear in linoleum
discolored light fixture globe	scratches, holes, or gouges in any door or wall
staining inside fireplace	missing door, missing or broken door stops
window cracked by settling	missing light fixture globe, bad/missing light bulbs
